Answer three questions from part II.
26 Prove: Tangents drawn to a circle from an external point are equal.

27 In the figure at the right, quadrilateral $A B C D$ is inscribed in circle $O$. Perpendiculars are drawn to diagonal $B D$ from $A$ and $C$ meeting $B D$ at $E$ and $K$ respectively. If arc $A B$ is equal to $\operatorname{arc} B C$, prove that $E D \times D C=A D \times K D . \quad[10]$


28 Prove: If two triangles have an angle of one equal to an angle of the other and the sides including these angles proportional, the triangles are similar. [10]

29 In parallelogram $A B C D, M$ is the mid-point of side $D C$. Line $A M$ extended meets $B C$ extended at $K$.
a Prove that triangle $A D M$ is congruent to triangle $C M K$. [4]
$b$ Prove that triangle $A K B$ is equal in area to parallelogram $A B C D$.
$30 A B$ is a chord of a circle and $C$ is the mid-point of minor arc $A B$. Chord $C D$ is drawn intersecting $A B$ at $E$. Chords $B D$ and $B C$ are drawn. Prove that if $B E$ is greater than $E C$, then $B D$ is greater than $B C$. [10]

31 Triangle $A B C$ is inscribed in a circle. Arcs $A B, B C$ and $C A$ are represented by $x+70^{\circ}$, $2 x+20^{\circ}$ and $3 x-30^{\circ}$ respectively.
$a$ Find $x$.

$b$ Show that triangle $A B C$ is equilateral.
$c$ If the bisector of angle $B$ and the tangent to the circle at $C$ when extended meet in $S$, find the number of degrees in angle $S$.

32 In the figure at the right, $A B$ is a tower and $C D$ is a flagpole, both of which are standing on level ground. The height of the tower is 82 feet and the distance ( $B D$ ) from the foot of the pole to the foot of the tower is 33 feet. If the angle of elevation of the sun (angle $A E B$ ) is $64^{\circ}$, find to the nearest foot
a the length of the shadow ( $B E$ ) of the tower [5]
$b$ the height of the pole [5]


33 In the figure at the right, arc $C B$ is the arc of a circle with $A$ as the center, arc $A C$ is the arc of a circle with $B$ as the center, and $A B=12$.
$a$ Find the area of sector $B A C$. [Answer may be left in terms of $\pi$.] [3]
$b$ Find the area of the segment bounded by chord $B C$ and $\operatorname{arc} B C$. [Answer may be left in radical form and in terms of $\pi$.] [4]
$c$ Find the area of the entire figure. [Answer may be left in radical form and in terms of $\pi$.] [3]


34 The difference between the areas of two similar triangles is 18 square feet.
a If $A$ represents the area of the smaller triangle, represent the area of the larger triangle in terms of $A$. [1]
$b$ If the ratio of the area of the larger triangle to the area of the smaller triangle is $4: 1$, write an equation that can be used to find $A$.
$c$ Find $A$. [3]
$d$ If one side of the smaller triangle is 5 feet, find the corresponding side of the larger triangle. [4]

1 The radius of a circle is 8 . Find the circumference of the circle. [Answer may be left in terms of $x$.]

2 The altitude of a trapezoid is 9 and the bases are 6 and 18. Find the area of the trapezoid.

3 The diagonals of a rhombus are 12 and 16 . Find a side of the rhombus.

4 The side of a regular polygon of 8 sides is $s$ and the apothem is $a$. Express the area of the polygon in terms of $a$ and $s$.

5 Two parallel lines are cut by a transversal. One of the two interior angles on the same side of the transversal is $30^{\circ}$ more than the other. Find the number of degrees in the smaller angle.

6 A secant and a tangent are drawn to a circle from an external point. If the tangent is 12 and the external segment of the secant is 6 , find the secant.

7 Chords $A B$ and $C D$ intersect within a circle at $E . A E=E B$, $C E=4$ and $E D=9$. Find $E B$.

$11 A B$ is the base of parallelogram $A B C D$. If $A D=10$ and angle $A=60^{\circ}$, find the altitude to side $A B$. [Answer may be left in radical form.]

12 A square is inscribed in a circle whose diameter is 8 . Find the area of the square.

13 The sum of the interior angles of a polygon is $1800^{\circ}$. How many sides has the polygon?

14 The base of an isosceles triangle is 20 inches long and a base angle is $57^{\circ}$. Find to the nearest inch the length of the altitude to the base.

15 In rectangle $A B C D, E$ is the mid-point of $D C$ and $F$ is the mid-point of $A D$. If $F E=7$, find diagonal $A C$.

16 Is statement $B$ the converse of statement $A$ ? [Answer yes or no.]
$A$ The three altitudes of an equilateral triangle are equal.
$B$ If the three altitudes of a triangle are equal, the triangle is equilateral.
